One of my favorite stories in the Bible (there are many!) is Moses in a battle with the Amalekites. They were a brutal nomadic tribe who harassed the Israelites in their journey from Egypt. In this battle, Moses stood on a hill and held out the staff of the Lord. As long as his hands were raised, the Israelites won. When he lowered his hands, the Amalekites started to win. It was a long battle, so a stone was brought for Moses to sit on, and Aaron and Hur took Moses' hands and held them up until sunset, thus ensuring the Israelites' victory.
