- **The Story of Jesus and Zacchaeus** (Luke 19:1-10), in which Jesus passes by everyone else in order to befriend the tax collector who was despised by the Jews.

I pray that we would be a church that welcomes all kinds of people, regardless of ethnicity, socioeconomic background, and political inclination, as we seek to share the saving gospel of Christ with our community.
