As I write this, I am reminded of the importance of having an eternal perspective. Amid the busyness of life and cares of the world, we can easily lose sight of eternity. When our perspective shifts exclusively to the present, we get easily frustrated by what we see on the news and easily angered by the world around us.

But when we view life from an eternal perspective, and set our minds on things above (Col. 3:1-3), we begin to understand what Paul meant when he spoke of the "peace of God, which surpasses all understanding," (Phil. 4:7). There are many things that consume our attention and affection today but will not matter on that day. As followers of Christ and heirs of an eternal inheritance, let's take a moment this week and ensure that we are living our lives for that which will still be significant 1,000,000 years from now.
