

# September 16 Newsletter

Every Wednesday our church holds a prayer meeting at 10:00am. Each week we have 10-20 individuals who gather for Bible study and an intentional time of prayer in the Sanctuary. Over the last two years we have been walking verse by verse through the Psalms each week. This week, we looked at Psalm 61. David begins this song in verse 1, "Hear my cry, O God, listen to my prayer." I was at first tempted to gloss over this simple verse, but it grabbed my attention this week. It was as simple yet profound reminder that David was a man of prayer.

In the book of Psalms we have 150 written songs of prayer and praise, the majority of which were written by King David. David was a man of prayer! David prayed regularly, fervently, and passionately. David prayed when things were good and when things were difficult. David prayed in victory and in defeat. It seems David did not just view prayer as a "checklist item" or a magical formula to use when things were hard. No, for David, prayer was part of the regular rhythm of his life. Was David perfect? Absolutely not. We know his sins that are clearly laid out in scripture. He was imperfect, but that shows the very need of prayer. His prayer life showed someone who continually was dependent on the Lord.

Our prayer life and our worship are closely related. David was a man of prayer and a man after God's own heart (1 Sam 13:14). Prayer shows who or what we are dependent upon. To not pray is to be dependent only on yourself. To pray is to show we recognize God's strength and our own weakness. Today what does your prayer life indicate about your worship to the Lord? Is prayer a last resort in times of crisis or is the regular rhythm of your life a disposition of prayerful dependence on the Lord?

E.M. Bounds says, "The secret of success in Christ's Kingdom is the ability to pray," and, "The most important lesson we can learn is how to pray." This week, will you commit to a deeper life of prayer?
