

September 2 Newsletter

This week, I had the opportunity to go with several other pastors in our area on a vision trip to New York City. Our Baptist association (Waccamaw Baptist Association) sponsored us to go and see what God is doing in the city and how we as First Baptist Surfside might be a part. I first want to say thank you, church, for allowing me to be gone a few days this week. For me, going on trips that are missions focused always help to bring perspective and clarity as to how we should be on mission.

When some people hear about missions in a place like New York, their thought may be, "why?" Why should we go and do missions far away when we have so many needs here? I don't want to downplay the needs we have here, but the needs in a place like New York are exponentially higher. Here we have a high person to church ratio, with many of those churches having ample resources to share the gospel. In a place like New York, neither of those things are true.

Let me try to paint a picture of the immense needs. The Metro New York Baptist Association is tasked with sharing the gospel within a 75-mile radius from Times Square. In that area there are 22-million people, with some areas as densely populated as 66,000 people per square mile. To put that in perspective, the current population of Myrtle Beach is less than 40,000 people. With that amount of people in NYC, the Baptist Association estimates that to effectively reach NYC for the gospel, they would need 20,000 churches to do so. Currently, there are 250 churches. That number is higher when you factor in other gospel preaching denominations, but the point is still that the need is immense.

The need is for churches that will share the gospel with NYC. Current estimates are that much of NYC is around 2% born again believers. According to the IMB (International Mission Board) that would be considered an unreached people group. We send people to every part of the globe to reach unreached people groups (and we should), yet we have one of the largest less than a 2 hour flight from us!

This week I met with several of the pastors who have devoted their lives to reach this city. God is doing incredible things through them and their churches, but they need help. They need churches to partner with them to pray for them, provide for them, and participate in what God is doing in the Citv.

This week would you stop and pray for the work God is doing in NYC? As you pray, pray for pastors Jordan, Logan, and Chris and their families working in NYC. Pray for God to provide for them in every way. Pray that God would send the gospel to NYC and pray perhaps how we can be involved in the future.
