This Sunday we will be completing our journey through the Gospel of Luke. For the past 15 months we have been journeying through Luke's account of Jesus' earthly ministry. As I think back to everything that has happened to me personally, in our church, and even in the world over the last 15 months, it is truly remarkable. So much has happened in that short time. Even now, as I write this newsletter the world as we know it is changing before our eyes as Russia invades the Ukraine. While the world is in chaos all around us, I am encouraged by how our church is still focused on what God has called us to be. Still grounded on His word, still moving forward to reach others for the gospel.

That is why it is so essential for us as a church to have a steady and healthy diet of God's Word. That's why it is essential to nourish our souls through the richness of his truths. That's why we go verse-by-verse through entire books of the Bible, to allow God to speak for himself and to let each nugget of truth give us spiritual sustenance to continue to move forward even when all else seems to fail. The truths that are found in the Gospel of Luke are timeless truths that keep us focused during such uncertainty.

Last, because Jesus has risen from the grave and has ascended to His throne, we are reminded we have a God who is sovereign. What we see in the world may have caught us off guard, but we find peace knowing that God is king over it all.

I pray that you will join us on Sunday and that you will invite one person to come with you. I pray this week each of us will be the hands and feet of Christ.


