Last night, I watched the first debate for the Republican presidential primary. A lot of things were said; some things that I found myself nodding my head in agreement with, and other things that made me concerned. But I was quickly reminded that every person on that stage–as well as every person in congress, every person in the Supreme Court, and whoever occupies the White House–will disappoint you.

As we enter into election season this next year, my prayer for our church family and churches everywhere, is that we would not be divisive over government politics. What unites us as a church family is the gospel of Jesus Christ, and on less important issues we can faithfully disagree but remain in fellowship with one another.

In emergency rooms, medical staff often "triage" the patients that come in. This means after a brief evaluation, they decide which patients need immediate and urgent treatment and prioritize accordingly. A person actively experiencing a heart attack is prioritized over someone with a low-grade fever.

In the church, we should do "theological triage." This means there are certain issues and doctrines that are more important than others. Think of these issues in three tiers:

Tier 1: These are issues that are essential to being a Christian. This would include: the dual nature of Jesus, the Trinity, Jesus' literal and physical resurrection from the dead, and the authority and sufficiency of Scripture.

Tier 2: These are issues that are not essential to being a Christian, but group people into different churches or denominations. This would include: baptism (babies or believers?), the Lord's Supper (open or closed?), pastors (men only?), or spiritual gifts (speaking in tongues?). While we may not fellowship in the same local church, we still celebrate the grace of Jesus in our lives.

Tier 3: These are issues that members of the same local church can agree to disagree about, yet still have wonderful fellowship together. This would include: the end times (pre-trib, post-trib, premillennial, postmillennial, amillennial?), the age of the earth (Old earth or young earth?), and politics.

Church family, the only thing that brings us all together is that we have all been changed by the transforming grace of Jesus Christ. Let's unite over the essentials and love one another as we seek to be faithful to the Lord in all things.
